September 2022 Newsletter (reported as of August 9, 2022)

The 2022-23 WCGL budget was presented to the Board on June 20th and approved by the Executive Board at its meeting that immediately followed. A copy of the 2022-23 budget will be available for viewing at the check-in desk at all monthly luncheons. At its meeting on July 29th the Executive Board approved the August 20th and 30th renewals of the two insurance policies that cover club liability, practices and stored items. The storage unit lease was extended by 13 months, ending August 25, 2023.

November 2022 Newsletter (reported as of October 4, 2022)

On August 11th, the WCGL initiated an online payment system for dues and events. SQUARE has proven to be an easy-to-use program for credit card payments from members. SQUARE complies with all Payment Card Industry Security Standards Council (PCI SSC) requirements via instant data encryption. As of September 30th, there have been 611 completed transactions, of which 22 were refunds. The Club is in sound financial condition that includes a reserve of \$10,000, or approximately 20% of expected income. Financials are available at each monthly luncheon for viewing.

The WCGL carries two insurance policies for each club year. The policies are written through our local State Farm Insurance agency in Lakeway. One policy covers Not-for-Profit Organization Liability for its members and directors. The other is a Business Owners Policy that covers damages: business assets, moneys and securities, forgeries and alterations, storage unit, and medical, among other items.

December 2022 Newsletter (reported as of November 7, 2022)

WCGL receives payments for dues and events by credit card payments online at SQUARE, using the links provided on our website and newsletters. The addition of the online payment system this year has benefitted both members as well as the Board and Chairs in keeping track of the Club's income.

We're finding that online payments are so easy that they can be easily put out of mind. I, myself, have looked 3 times to make sure that I have signed up for the next Luncheon. Checking your credit card account will put your mind at ease and verify your payment, or non-payment. Accessing your credit card account is your friend, AND you can keep a timely eye on any charges that you don't recognize. As a reminder, printed financial reports for your review are available at every Monthly Luncheon at the front desk.

January 2023 Newsletter (reported as of December 6, 2022)

At midterm, we take measure of the Club's financial position—WCGL being sound and steady. The Board closely monitors the use of New Member and Event income and ensures that the Club performs within its tenet established 38 years ago by our Founding Members. At the heart of it, though, is the hope and goal for all members to socialize: meet and enjoy each other's company, participate and contribute-at-will time and energy to the Special Interest Groups. If you're one of the lucky door-prize winners at the monthly luncheon, just know that the gift is a small token from the heart of the Club!

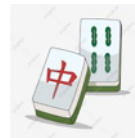
