RECORDING SECRETARY

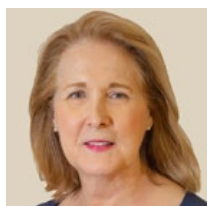

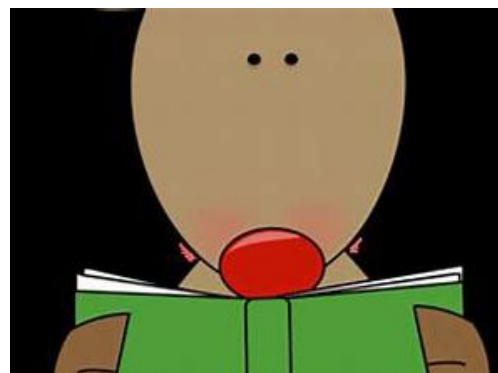
We meet at member homes at 10:00 a.m. on the 2nd Monday of each month all year. Members are sent an email reminder before the meeting. During our meetings we share projects,
