We receive a check quarterly, and the Women's Club can then use that money to subsidize, for example, our Brunches and other events! retirement from the University of Texas 60 years later. Her reminiscences will explore how this key region changed over the years including the rise of theocracy, the end of the Cold War and the changing role of women in society. From the Arabian Nights to Egypt under Sadat, the Iranian Revolution, multinational firms and government scandals, the West Bank Intifadah, Turkish exile moguls, Armenian independence, Egypt post-Covid, and a bus ride through the boonies of Morocco...Kate's been there!

Kate Gillespie holds a BA Magna Cum Laude from Harvard University, an MBA from the University of Virginia and a Ph.D. from the London Business School. She has lived and worked in Egypt, Iran, England and Switzerland and taught courses in Finland, France and Mexico. She was a faculty member in international business and global marketing at the McCombs Business School at The University of Texas at Austin for most of her academic career where she also served as Associate Director of Middle East Studies and Chair of the Global Marketing SIG of the American Marketing Association.

RECORDING SECRETARY

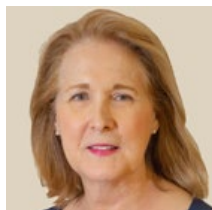


The Recording Secretary takes the official minutes at all Women's Club Board Meetings and General meetings. The minutes of the previous General Meeting will be available in the

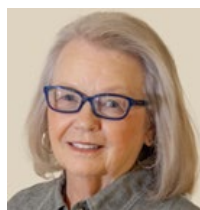

Are you ready for the total Eclipse on April 8th? A lot of various celebrations are being planned on this day so be sure to join in the fun. The moon will pass directly between the Earth and sun completely blocking the sun's face. NASA informs us that Dallas, Texas will be in the direct path of this Eclipse, but we probably will have almost the full effect. The total Eclipse only lasts about 4 minutes and 28 seconds starting at 1:40 p.m. but a partial Eclipse will begin around 12:23 p.m. and last until 3:02 p.m. The last total Eclipse happened on August 21, 2017, but won't occur again until **August 2044**, so you better get ready to view this special event **with Protective Glasses** of course. I am going to try to

DINNER CLUB – Closed

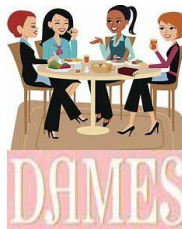


The Dinner Club offers members a social evening of good company and delicious food three times each session.

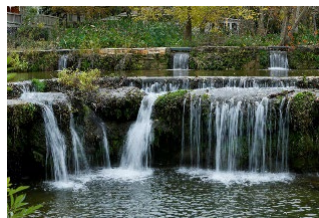
