

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE



March has a rich history: The name "March" is derived from Mars, the Roman god of war. As the god of war, Mars was linked to agriculture,

symbolizing a time for the renewal of life and growth. This connection likely arose because March signified the beginning of a time when the soil could be worked for planting.

In the early Roman calendar (which was initially based on the lunar cycle), March was the first month of the year. It was a time to mark the start of spring, which was a significant season for the Romans. The calendar was later reformed into the Julian calendar, shifting the start of the year to January. The Julian calendar, introduced by Julius Caesar, restructured the year into 365 days and 12 months, which established January 1 as the start of the year.

One of the most famous events in March is the *Ides of March*, which refers to the 15th day of the month. In 44 BCE, it was on the Ides of March that Julius Caesar was assassinated by a group of Roman senators. This event has since become one of the most well-known in Roman history and is often associated with betrayal and the power struggles of ancient Rome.

In many cultures, March marks the spring equinox, which usually falls around March 20 or 21. The equinox is the moment when day and night are nearly equal in length, and it signifies the arrival of spring in the Northern Hemisphere. For this reason, March has also been a month of celebration and renewal across various cultures.

March Holidays and Events:

- St. Patrick's Day (March 17):
 Originally a feast day for St.
 Patrick, the patron saint of Ireland,
 St. Patrick's Day has become a
 celebration of Irish culture and
 heritage, widely recognized around
 the world.
- Women's History Month (U.S. and U.K.): In the United States, March is recognized as Women's History Month, a time to reflect on and celebrate the contributions of women throughout history.
- March Madness: This is a popular term in the United States referring to the NCAA basketball tournament, which takes place in March and has a significant cultural following.

The Symbolism of March is reflected in astrology. March zodiac signs are Pisces and then from March 21st Aires. Pisces represents intuition and emotion, while Aries is linked to energy, initiative and leadership.

Spring Equinox - The winter's grip begins to fade, A gentle thaw, a sweet cascade. The sun ascends, with golden rays, Awakening the earth's embrace.

WELCOME TO THE MOST TALKED ABOUT NEIGHBORHOOD IN AUSTIN, TEXAS!

Community First! Village is a master planned neighborhood that provides affordable, permanent housing and a supportive community for men and women who are coming out of chronic homelessness. A development of **Mobile Loaves & Fishes**, this transformative residential program exists to love and serve our neighbors who have been living on the streets, while also empowering the surrounding community into a lifestyle of service with the homeless.

Today, Community First! Village occupies 51 acres on Hog Eye Road in northeast Travis County. It is currently home to more than 370 formerly homeless neighbors and will soon

provide housing and community for just more than 500 of our friends who once struggled to survive on the streets of Austin.

Neighbor Engagement Volunteer Opportunities

Are you interested in hosting an event or providing a service for our neighbors? There is a page on their website to fill out a form and become a Member of their team. Within a week they will start a conversation with you about bringing your idea to Community First! Village. If you have any questions, please reach out to serve@mlf.org.

Group Serve Interest

They would love for your group to serve alongside us here in the most talked about neighborhood in Austin! We generally host groups of 5+ volunteers on Tuesdays – Saturdays from 9am – 12pm October through April and from 8am to 11am May through September. A typical Group Serve Event could entail working in our gardens, dry landscaping yards for micro-homes, laying pathways, tending our chicken coops, or other projects that beautify the property, but there are occasionally other projects available.

All Group Serve Events must be coordinated directly through MLF Staff at least 2 weeks in advance, and preferably 3 months in advance for a group of more than 50 people requiring additional funding and coordination. The form they provide asks you to tell them more about your group and someone from their Volunteer Team will follow up with you about your group's reservation! Dignified Income & Neighbor Leadership Every one of their volunteer groups is led by a current neighbor of Community First! Village. Hosting groups like yours is one of the ways our neighbors are able to earn a dignified income, which in turn enables them to do things like pay rent and buy groceries. We ask groups to contribute \$10 per person, which goes toward the dignified income of the neighbors leading you that day as well as purchase of any tools or materials necessary for projects you'll be working on.

Volunteering With Kids

The best volunteer opportunities to bring along younger children are in our Genesis Gardens program as a **Farm Helper** or helping our team tend to the more than 100 chickens at the Village on **Farm Animal Friday**. Please note that

these opportunities are for children 5 years or older.

If you're bringing along teenagers, they can join in on **any opportunities through our** Genesis Gardens or Neighbor Care Programs. However, volunteers under 18 years old are not permitted to volunteer at the Village unaccompanied and must be with an adult at all times.

If your teenager is in need of community service hours, we are more than happy to sign off on their volunteer hours, but they will need to supply their own documentation

If you'd like to schedule a Group Service Event through a school, faith community, or other organization, please fill out their Group Serve Interest Form and someone from our Volunteer Team will be in touch with you!

Note: Groups with children 10 and younger will be led on an interactive extended tour of the Village instead of being assigned to volunteer projects.
