What an exciting year ahead! As Parliamentarian I will be working with Sheila in the fall to amend any of the Bylaws and Standing Rules that may need clarification for our members. If changes are deemed

necessary, the Parliamentarian and a committee of two appointed by the president will meet January through February to make amendments. They will then present the amendments to the Executive Committee in early March. Once approved by the Executive Committee, the amendments will be presented to the Standing Committee at the March Board Meeting and to Membership at the March General Meeting.

The Parliamentarian is also responsible for chairing the Nominating Committee consisting of five members at large appointed by the Executive Committee minus the President. For this purpose, the 1<sup>st</sup> Vice President chairs the committee and the Parliamentarian becomes a non-voting chair of the Nominating Committee. The Nominating Committee is appointed by early January. The committee's role is to propose a Slate of Nominees for the 2022-2023 Women's Club Executive Committee.

Recommendation forms will be distributed to members starting at the January 2022 General Meeting. Members will give input to the Nominating Committee in selecting new officers. Nominations will also be taken from the floor at the March General Meeting and the election will take place at the April General Meeting followed by the installation in May 2022.
