The Executive Committee presented the 2023-24 WCGL budget to and was approved by the Board of Directors at its meeting on June 30th. A copy of the budget will be available for viewing at the check-in desk at all monthly general

meetings. The two State Farm Insurance policies that cover club liability, practices and stored items were renewed in July. The storage unit lease was extended by 12 months ending August 25, 2024. The Board of Directors approved the revised 2023-24 budget by e-vote beginning August 1st-4th, specifically that portion regarding the budget for monthly general meeting meals, described earlier in this newsletter.
