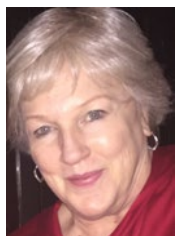

RECORDING SECRETARY

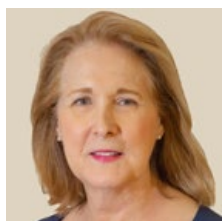


The Recording Secretary takes the official minutes at all Women's Club Board Meetings and General Meetings. The minutes of the previous General Meeting will be available in the

Fun times ahead!

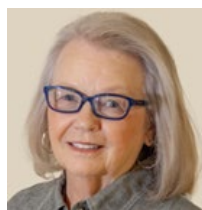

DINNER CLUB – Closed



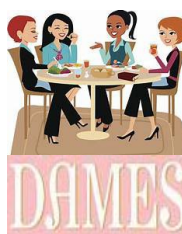
The Dinner Club offers members a social evening of good company and delicious food three times each session.

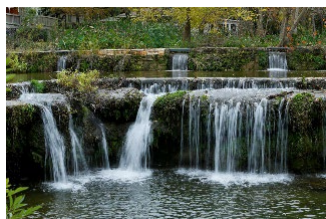
