More important (if you are of Irish ancestry) is the celebration of St. Patrick's Day on March 17th. One of the more spectacular celebratory events is found in the windy city of Chicago. Here, the 60-year-old tradition of dyeing the Chicago River emerald green is the prelude to the start of the one of the largest St. Patrick's Day parades in the USA.

In the morning, members of the Chicago Plumbers Union, Local 130 board 3 boats and spread 40 pounds of environmentally friendly orange dye into the Chicago River. Flour sifters are used to spread the dye into the water followed by the 3rd boat that acts as a mixer in the water. Within minutes the river turns into a vibrant emerald green which lasts 4-5 hours. The formula for the dye is a closely kept secret...many cities have unsuccessfully tried to duplicate this emerald green effect. The Chicago River banks are lined with 400,000 plus spectators to watch the river transformation and parade.

My family and I have witnessed the windy city change into the emerald city of Oz. Our awestruck faces mimicked Dorothy and her friends at the end of the yellow brick road. Chicago's celebrations are a homage to Irish ancestry who settled and built this city.
